Texture Sound Path

Grades K - 2+



Purpose of this activity:

To link sounds with movement and tactile experiences, helping students internalize phonics concepts as well as work on beginning sounds.

What you'll need:

Different textured materials (for example, carpet squares, bubble wrap, sandpaper, etc.) and letter cards (or phonics sounds).

How to play:

- 1. Lay out the textured materials in a line or path on the floor.
- 2. Place a flashcard with a letter or phonics sound next to each textured material.
- 3. Walk along the path, stepping on each material as they go. When you step on a material, pick up the flashcard and say the letter or sound.
- 4. Try to think of a word that would describe how the texture feels and see if you can think of a word that begins with the letter you picked up (for example, "The rough sandpaper is like the sound 'r'.").
- 5. Continue until you reach the end of the path and have said the sound of each letter.
